

Week 17 - Monday

*Scriptures

Revelation 22:12 - "And behold I come quickly and my reward is with me (to give every man according as his work shall be)."

Begin your morning in prayer and Bible reading, followed by gathering around your Scripture verse chart.

Review the A-P verses, pointing to each word as you read together. Be sure to build the excitement of a new verse!!

Review A-P Bible Verse songs together, and add Q song.

*Scripture Activities

- 1. Begin another verse strip, writing out the entire Q verse on a long strip of poster board. Have your child say it along with you several times. Depending on the age of your child, you can shorten this verse as shown above.
- 2. Read Revelation 22:12-13. What do these verses tell us? They tell us of a promise God has made He IS coming back! With Him will be a reward for each of us, according to the work we've done <u>for Him</u> on Earth. These works won't give us salvation, but God will reward sacrifices made for His kingdom.

He goes on to tell who He is - Alpha and Omega - the first and last, beginning and end. He was here before the beginning, and will be here always.

*Letters

Begin by reviewing the A-P signs, visual recognition (ABC folders - and ask them to tell you what letter it is), and auditory recognition (what do the letters sound like). How do you sign the letters, and what are some words that begin with those letters?

Today, you'll introduce the letter "Q,q", it's sounds, and it's sign.

Q - 'gwuh'.. gueen - g.... 'gwuh' guail - g.... 'gwuh'- guaint

*Letter - Hands On

- 1. Create the Q,q page for your ABC book today. Draw a block letter "Q" and "q" at the top, and ask your child to name something that begins with Q that they'd like you to draw. Allow them to either color or glue/glitter in the letters and picture. Once dry, place in ABC book to reference each day. Don't forget to finger trace!
- 2. Q is for Quick. Our verse this week says that Jesus will come back quickly. He will come in the twinkling of an eye, faster than we can imagine! We don't know when, but the day is coming soon another way to think of it is that He will be here quicker than we know. Have you ever heard someone say "it happened before I knew it!"? Well, that's what it will be like when Christ returns!

Today, let your child get some 'quick' action. Have different kinds of races, and if warm enough, go outside for a running race. Who is the quickest?

Other race ideas being a paper airplane race, boat race, toy car race - again, which is quickest?

<u>*Letter - Sign Language - Q</u>



Make a G (thumb and index finger pointing outward, other fingers tucked under), then simply bend your wrist downward – like an downward G sign – this is Q.

*Numbers

Review 0-15 first, numbers and words. Introduce the number "16", S-I-X-T-E-E-N and sign today.

Review how the double digit numbers build upon themselves, getting one number larger each time. Starting with 1-0, then 1-1, 1-2, 1-3, 1-4, 1-5.... What number do you think comes next? 1- (what?). Today we're learning 1-6, which is the number 16!

*Number activity

Pull out your number binder, reviewing your 0-15 cards, and today you'll create a "16" card.

Drawing block letters, spell out the word "SIXTEEN", then draw a bubble number "16". Glue and glitter.

Remember to always use capital letters when writing with your preschooler

Pull out the BINGO game for review today.

<u>*Sign Language - 16</u>





To sign 16, make a ten (with your palm facing in, towards your body), and then make a 6 (with your palm facing out).

*Trapezoid

Begin by reviewing your color and shape flashcards together, tracing the outline of the words with your fingers. Do you remember what shape we learned last week? Practice drawing it in the air. Introduce the trapezoid this week.

We've learned that a circle is just one line that goes around and around. There was no shape with two sides, so we learned the shape with three sides next - the triangle. From there we learned about a shape with four equal sides - the square, and a four sided shape with 2 long sides/ 2 short sides - the rectangle.

Last week we learned another shape with four sides - the diamond! A diamond is similar to a square in that all 4 sides are the same length. BUT what is different is that you 'squeeze' two of the corners into one another a little.


This week will learn yet another 4 sided shape - the trapezoid. The trapezoid has 4 sides, to of which are parallel, and the other two angle in towards each other. See below.



*Trapezoid - Hands On

Experiment with different ways you can make your own trapezoids! If you have blocks that are shapes, you can show how different shapes put together create a trapezoid. Two triangles an a square or rectangle, or 4 triangles!





Continue making other shapes as well!

Can you make a trapezoid in the air? You can also practice drawing trapezoids. You can pencil draw a few and have your child trace them - older children can probably look at one you've drawn and draw their own.

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
